## FINANCIAL SUMMARY DETAILS

Port Catholic School's fiscal year is July 1 - June 30th. All the financial data reported is reflected within this time period. As a result, income or expenses incurred during this time, but not paid within the "fiscal year" may skew the year's financials.

### School Year Profit Details

- A single bequest was made to the school for over \$105,270. This was not included in the current year budget.
- Annual fund donations and general donations were over \$35,200: \$9,700 over budget.
- Prior year parish subsidies of \$90,125 were paid to the school in the current year. Prior year subsidies were not included in the current year budget.
- Home & School fundraising activities netted \$130,283: \$35,283 over the current year budget total.
- Prior year tuition and childcare fees of \$25,230 were paid in the current year. Prior year tuition and fees were not included in the current year budget.

In short, the reflected year-end profit partially compensates for last year's reflected year-end loss. Port Catholic's financial outlook is very bright. The school is going strong and will continue to offer Catholic education to Port Washington and its surrounding areas for many years to come.

# STUDENT COUNCIL PLAYGROUND RENOVATION PROJECT

Port Catholic's Student Council has made significant strides on playground improvements. At this time, the majority of improvements have been achieved at Saint Mary's. A portable basketball hoop and tetherball set was purchased for the Saint Mary's playground. Additionally, because of the generosity of local businesses which supported for this project, we were able to purchase and install a second tetherball this school year. Final plans for Saint Mary's playground include moving and installing the "caterpillar" currently on the Saint Peter's playground.

St. Peter playground improvements are in the planning stages. The Council has contracted to have the caterpillar moved to Saint Mary's. As soon as that is completed another swing set will be purchased for the St. Peter's playground. Newport Shores also donated a volleyball set that will be installed along with the swings. The next playground improvement is cleaning and repainting the "tubes." If sufficient funds remain we will consider buying another piece of equipment for Saint Peter's.

Although the Student Council initiated and provided the initial seed money for this project, it has been the generosity of local businesses and organizations that has made this project a reality. Before the end of the last school year, the Council received pledges of support from Saint Peter's Parish, the Saint Peter's Mens Club, the Port Catholic Athletic Association, and a donation from Mrs. Audrey Michalowski in memory of her husband, Fred.

In addition to these pledges, last June, just after the conclusion of the school year, Student Council representatives went to a number of local businesses asking for additional donations necessary to complete this project. We more than exceeded our expectations, and will honor these businesses and organizations with a plaque at Saint Peter's when we complete our work. Those that contributed include:

In response to communication issues raised during the recently completed viability study we are in the process of moving to an online grading system called Fast Direct. In addition to online grading, this system includes electronic "bulletin boards" which will allow teachers and parents to receive and send information, such as homework assignments, notification of pending projects or tests, and reminders about special events. It is our intention to eventually eliminate the current progress report process since instantaneous access to grades will be possible. Grading, hot lunch, and attendance will also be part of this system.

Because of the learning curve involved in developing and implementing this system properly, we do not anticipate being online before the second semester, and possibly not before the fourth quarter of this year. However, once implemented, Fast Direct will be available to all parents. Like so many other programs, this system needs a percentage grade in order to translate it into the electronic grade book. Since the elementary grades don't use "absolute" percentages in grading, the decision has been made to follow the pattern used at the elementary levels at the Port public schools, and not put the grade book portion of this program online for Saint Mary's students. However, all other aspects of the program will be utilized for all students. Once we are confident in our use of the system, parents will receive a confidential password, which will grant them exclusive access to their child's(ren's) grade book. More information will follow as we move toward full implementation of this program.

## S.I.P.

In this age of acronyms, here comes another one! S.I.P. stands for School Improvement Program. Port Catholic has always participated in a constant process of school improvement through its cycle of review and evaluation associated with accreditation. However the S.I.P. is different in that it requires a school to provide a more comprehensive report as to how it will accomplish its' improvement goals.

Our initial improvement goal is based on analysis of our standardized testing results. After a review of this data, and with the assistance of Mr. Ted Neitzke, our faculty has developed a very ambitious goal to have all students score at the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile or above on the Iowa tests by 2016.

While we are targeting all areas, our immediate emphasis will be on math, vocabulary, and language arts. This is an extremely ambitious goal which can only be achieved with the full cooperation of our parents. Students will be receiving specific homework and practice sheets intended to help them strengthen weak areas. We ask for your full cooperation in placing an emphasis on students doing their best with these homework assignments.

While our plan was formed using our Iowa Test results, multiple assessment tools are an integral part of assuring that students have indeed mastered the content knowledge and skills of an academic area. So, in addition to the Iowa Test and class performance on tests and quizzes, we are exploring the possibility of participating in the M.A.P., (yes another acronym!), which stands for Measure of Academic Performance. This test, which is done on a computer, will be given twice a year, in the fall and spring. While this is a test of mastery, it also gives us a measure by which we can gauge each student's individual growth. In essence, each student is being measured against him or herself to see how much he or she has progressed during the year. We are also considering substituting the Explore Test for the Iowa Test for all 8<sup>th</sup> graders. We are just at the beginning of this six-year project and as we work our way through the plan more information will follow.
